The Glenelg District Cricket Club (GDCC, the Club) invites junior players (boys and girls) from within, or bordering, the defined Glenelg Metro Grade zone (i.e. the Glenelg zone comprises Post Codes 5044, 5045, 5046, 5047, 5048, 5049 and 5158) to attend pre-season selection trials and training sessions for its junior teams for season 2022/23: -

- Glenelg Junior Cricket Academy (U12)
- SACA four Premier Cricket under-age competitions; Under 14 Reds and Whites and Under 16 Reds and Whites
- SACA Ray Sutton Shield (U13)

Please note that there is separate information around the selection trials provided for our nominated country area in the South East for the junior teams above which can be found on our website or by contacting the Junior Coordinator.

The GDCC seeks to develop talented junior players to contribute to the long-term success of the club and beyond to the elite level. We take pride in our custodianship of the 'Spirit-of-Cricket' and playing 'The Glenelg Way'.

We are a community-based sporting organisation committed to the development and promotion of cricket within the City of Holdfast Bay and our South Australian Cricket Association (SACA) nominated country areas (Mt Gambier – Chappell/Whitty Academy). ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The allocation of age-group competitions is based on the player's age as of 1 September prior to the start of the new season. As of 1 September 2022:

- Under 12 (Academy) Players must be 11 (or younger)
- Under 14 players must be 13 (or younger)
- Under 16 players must be 15 (or younger)

Applicants should have at least one season of playing experience with a Community Club.

SEASON 2022/23 SELECTION TRIALS

All completed and signed applications can be scanned and sent to gdccjuniors@gmail.com and we will process them from there. All applications and payment must be received by 5pm Monday 21st of March 2022.

Only players, who have lodged their completed forms, including a signed copy of the Code of Conduct, and paid their pre-season registration fee will be allowed to participate in the selection trials.

If this is not possible, please ensure forms and payment are lodged at the first selection training session. Having the forms pre-completed and players registered aims to speed up the overall registration process, reduce congestion and waiting time at the indoor training centre, and allows the coaches and registered players to get on with training.

INDOOR TRAINING (VENUE, DATES, TIME AND COSTS)

Gillespie Sports Indoor Cricket Centre, 375 Cross Road, EDWARDSTOWN

The selection trials will be held at the Gillespie Sports Indoor Centre at 375 Cross Road, EDWARDSTOWN. Players are to bring their own cricket gear, wear their current official club training uniform or school/club white playing top and black/dark shorts and bring a drink. **Representative gear (SAPSASA, SAMCA etc.) is not to be worn.**

There will also be a short information/introduction presentation to new parents once the players are signed in and have started. All parents/carers are encouraged to attend if possible. Parents are welcome to stay afterwards to watch the session – however, space is limited.

Parents are reminded to NOT stand behind the bowlers and distract the batsmen. Likewise, there should be no interaction between the player and parent/carer while they are in the nets. The coaches will give the players all the instruction and guidance they require.

COMPETITIONS, SQUADS AND TRAINING

SACA Premier Cricket U14 and U16

GDCC fields four teams for the SACA Premier Cricket junior competitions. Successful applicants are selected to form squads for each age group. From these squads, pre-season training will inform further selection to the Red and White divisions based on team balance, player skill set and maturity. It is expected that as the season progresses, players will move between the divisions from time to time, as illness, school and state selections etc. effect player availability. The Club strongly encourages this movement of players and is an integral part of player development. Players train twice a week with the days to be confirmed.

Ray Sutton Shield (U13)

Players must be 12 or under on 1 September 2022 to be eligible for selection in this mini-season competition held over October-November. Games are held over 1 day and are played on Sunday afternoons for the first 5 weeks of the season there is an extra week for the Final. Trialling for this squad will be by invitation only. Generally, the squad is selected from age eligible player's trialling for the U14 squads and some in the Academy. Dates to be confirmed.

Glenelg Junior Cricket Academy - U12

This development squad will comprise up to a maximum of 18 players and is seen as an integral entry point to the GDCC Junior's program. The Academy developmental program consists of training and some matches. Most of our current juniors and many seniors started with the club at this point. Selected players are required to train one night per week with Glenelg and play for their local community club on Sunday mornings.

Announcement of Squads

All squads will be finalised at the completion of the indoor selection trials and then communicated to parents/players on the clubs website www.gdcc.net.au/juniors.html by Thursday April 21, 2022. Emails will be sent to the unsuccessful applicants in the first instance.

Other Considerations

Where appropriate there may be opportunities for age eligible players to cross between competitions. For example, an established U14 player may be young enough to play in Academy matches. Likewise, we also encourage and promote the opportunity for our Chappell-Whitty Academy players to come to Adelaide to train and play in our teams.

One of the most vital considerations for players who are not selected is not to worry that you may have missed out. There are many reasons why some players are not selected. The coaches will give you feedback and some ideas on what you need to do for the future. Most importantly, keep playing and practicing. Play ideally for a community club and your school. In your back yard, at the beach, wherever you can...just keep playing. Of course, the coaching coordinators will welcome the opportunity to discuss any issues further.

TRANSITION TO SEASON TRAINING

The following information is a guide to what will happen for all selected players as the preseason progresses. More detailed information and a Selected Players Handbook will be made available later.

Outdoor Training (Venue, Dates and Session Times)

In September, training will commence. Players will still need to bring their own cricket gear, wear club training uniform and cap/hat and bring a drink. Further dates and times will be confirmed in the Players Handbook.

Pre-Season Trial Games

If pre-season trial games are played they are usually played in September. It is important players are available to play in the organised trial games as the Red/White selections will be based on trial game performance, training form and attendance, and overall behaviour and attitude. Dates and times to be advised.

Uniform

Once players are selected, playing and training uniforms are to be ordered early during the pre-season to ensure all players have all uniform items for round one. Details, dates and times to be advised.

Helmet Colour/s: YELLOW or WHITE Only

For Glenelg players playing in the SACA Grade U14s and U16s competitions your helmet colour must be **YELLOW** (the club's nominated colour) or **WHITE** (neutral colour). This is a non-negotiable due to SACA guidelines.

It is a SACA requirement that all helmets conform to the Cricket Australia and ICC recommended British Standards BS: 7928:2013. Please check these details with your supplier.

Player and Parent Code of Conduct

Players, parents and coaches/officials are all required to adhere to the club's formal "Code of Conduct" as well as Cricket Australia's "Spirit of Cricket" www.cricketaustralia.com.au/about/mission-and-values/spirit-of-cricket. This includes a social media use policy.

Each player and at least one parent are required to acknowledge the "Code of Conduct" by signing the form provided below.

Behaviour on field is pivotal to the player's successful engagement to play in 'the Glenelg Way'. The Club has a zero-tolerance policy towards vilification or discrimination of any person based on gender, religion, culture, sexual orientation or abilities etc. Players who indulge in this behaviour will face disciplinary action and will be asked to leave the club or sent back to their community club until such behaviour has been rectified. 'Sledging' is strongly discouraged, and the umpires are asked by the Club to warn players if this behaviour presents in any circumstance and report it to any team official. These expectations are also extended to parents and other club supporters.

The GDCC encourages fair play, praise where appropriate and encouragement in times of struggle, acceptance of other's mistakes, acceptance of personal shortcomings, positively celebrate all achievements and to play the game 'In the Spirit of Cricket'.

The GDCC relies on an extensive network of volunteers for game day support. This is an integral requirement of parental engagement. Coaches are not expected to co-ordinate pre or post game activities, their job is to coach. However, they will provide advice and general direction. Parent/family involvement includes scoring (a roster will be used) and ground set up and break down. There are also many opportunities for engagement with the Club in other activities which will present themselves as the season progresses.

Junior Cricket Committee – Squads/Sides Require Representation (Volunteers Needed)

The junior committee is an important part of the effective running of the juniors' teams and plays a pivotal role in many of the decisions around competition management. Parents are encouraged to speak to the Junior Coordinator if they are interested in getting involved. Roles that committee members take on include Secretary, Finance Officer, My-Cricket administrator, Scorer Roster, Child Safety Officer Etc. The committee meets once a month in the clubrooms from July to March. If you can help, please contact the Junior Cricket Co-ordinator.

- Focus on your child's effort and performance, rather than winning and losing
- Ensure players are available for training and games as often as possible
- Encourage the player to advise the coach of unavailability for training and games as soon as possible
- Support coaches and team managers on game day. Parents game day duties can include
 - Field of play and scorer table set up and breakdown
 - Arrange eskies and player's drinks
 - Organise afternoon tea to be served
 - Scoring (a rotating roster will be provided)
 - Umpiring where required
 - Ensure all rubbish is removed and the team area is left neat and tidy
- Celebrate and enjoy the successes of all players and the team
- Support the coach to provide a consistent message to players regarding their development
- Support club activities and fundraisers
- Provide positive support to players, coaches and all match officials

- Always play by the rules. Never argue with an official. If you disagree, have your captain, coach or manager approach an official during a break or after the completion of the game.
- Control your temper. Verbal abuse of officials, other players, deliberately distracting or provoking (sledging) will not be tolerated.
- The Club has a zero-tolerance policy towards vilification or discrimination of any person based on gender, religion, culture, sexual orientation or abilities etc.
- Work equally hard for yourself and your team. Your performance will benefit - so will your team.
- Be a good sport. Applaud good plays regardless of the team.
- Treat all players, as you would like to be treated. Do not interfere with, bully or take unfair advantage of another player.
- Co-operate with your coach, teammates and opponents. Without them, there would be no competition.
- Place in proper perspective the isolated incidents of unsporting behaviour, rather than make such incidents the 'highlight' of the event.
- All talk must stop when the bowler reaches their bowling mark.
- Bad language (swearing) is not permitted.
- Once a batter is dismissed, members of the fielding team are not permitted to give the batter a "send-off".
- 'Good sports' behaviour is expected.
- Use of any digital device (incl. mobile phone) is not acceptable during playing hours unless requested of and approved by the coach/team manager in control of the team.
- Any Social Media communication channels used to abuse/bully/harass opposition players/officials or any player or official associated with Glenelg will not be tolerated.

- Entry by parents on to the field of play is not permitted (SACA By-law).
- Coaches do the coaching; parents may be involved only with the coaches' approval.

 - ask the second to last child and their parent / guardian to wait with the coach / official and the child
 - get parents / guardians to collect their children from the oval area or club rooms
 - avoid transporting children to their homes unless permission has been given by parents / guardians and;
 - As a last resort coaches will try and make contact with the parent / guardian.

What we ask you to do

- Pick your children up on time or make other arrangements.
- Regardless of age pick up your children from the oval area or club rooms, not from a street location.
- Inform the coach about any changes in arrangements for picking up your child.
